Players

We all have a responsibility to promote high standards of behaviour in the game.
As a player, you have a big part to play.
That's why The FA is asking every player to follow a Respect Code of Conduct.



When playing football, children will:

- Always play to the best of their ability
- Play fairly – won't cheat, complain or waste time
- Respect team-mates, the other team, the referee or own coach/manager
- Play by the rules, as directed by the referee
- Shake hands with the other team and referee at the end of the game
- Listen and respond to what their coach/ team manager tells them
- Talk to someone they trust or the club welfare officer if they are unhappy about anything at club.

If the above code is not followed, any/all of the following actions may be taken by club, County FA or The FA:

Players may:

- Be required to apologise to team-mates, the other team, referee or team manager
- Receive a formal warning from the coach or the club committee
- Be dropped or substituted
- Be suspended from training
- Be required to leave the club.

In addition:

- The club, County FA or The FA may make parents or carers aware of any infringements of the Code of Conduct
- The FA/County FA could impose a fine and suspension against the club.

Spectators, Parents/Carers, Coaches and Everyone Else

We all have a responsibility to promote high standards of behaviour in the game. This club is supporting The FA's Respect programme to ensure football can be enjoyed in a safe, positive environment. Remember children's football is a time for them to develop their technical, physical, tactical and social skills. Winning isn't everything. Play your part and observe The FA's Respect Code of Conduct for spectators and parents/carers at all times.

I will:

- Remember that children play for FUN
- Applaud effort and good play as well as success
- Always respect the match officials' decisions
- Remain outside the field of play and within the Designated Spectators' Area (where provided)
- Let the coach do their job and not confuse the players by telling them what to do
- Encourage the players to respect the opposition, referee and match officials
- Avoid criticising a player for making a mistake – mistakes are part of learning
- Never engage in, or tolerate, offensive, insulting, or abusive language or behaviour.

I understand that if I do not follow the Code, any/all of the following actions may be taken by my club, County FA, league or The FA:

I may be:

- Issued with a verbal warning from a club or league official
- Required to meet with the club, league or County FA Welfare Officer
- Required to meet with the club committee
- Obligated to undertake an FA education course
- Obligated to leave the match venue by the club
- Requested by the club not to attend future games
- Suspended or have my club membership removed
- Required to leave the club along with any dependents.

In addition:

- The FA/County FA could impose a fine and/ or suspension on the club.
